Pedagogical aim: The project studies and develops students' interest in literature and literature reading habits. It improves students' literacy skills and compares good practices in literature teaching in Finland, Hungary and Romania.

Details: Reading skills of students are studied, measured and evaluated all over Europe and outside. In the PISA tests the Finnish are always on the top, the Hungarians are in the bottom half as well as the students in Romania. Why not share our practises at school for developing our students reading skills? Why not motivate our students to become better readers through good examples of European fiction, making them compete and win with reading - while making friends. Let's involve them in a programme where they can decide what to read every month from a list carefully selected from the values of European literature; where they can create a survey to reveal the similarities and the differences between the reading habits of the given generation. Let's make them interested in cooperating nations' literature, best-known poets and writers.

Procedure: Between the project meetings students of each school do several tasks paralelly keeping in touch and sharing their work on TwinSpace in English, every time they meet they present what they achieved and did and they can evaluate their findings. On the spot of the meeting they can visit museums, libraries, the birthplaces or graves of the famous writers. Students' presentations, performances will make these meetings memorable.

Evaluation: All the results of surveys will be presented, and the competitions will have some feedback role, too. The students will evaluate their and each other's development and so will the teachers do.
